We have finally been able to install the defibrillator supported inpart by a previous Par Bay Big Local award. Local resident Chris Wilson successfully completed a London Marathon as part of his fundraising. It is now in place on the wall between Boots and Cornubia. The Par Carnival committee voted unanimously to assist with running costs of regular checks and maintenance by FLEET.

The Walking for Health group continues to meet weekly. A Christmas lunch is planned for December and new routes will be investigated in the New Year.

Community Garden

It's been a busy and productive year at the Community Garden. The bee and butterfly garden have given a lovely display of flowers of different colours, and some of the vegetables have done well in the warm weather. We planted a wide range this year including beetroot, leeks, lettuce, peppers and spinach, and we had a good crop of courgettes and green beans. The experiment with outdoor tomatoes was a huge success. Our plants grew and grew, and produced some beautiful sweet ripe tomatoes and plenty of green ones which went to make chutney.

Keeping the plants watered was a challenge in the long dry spell this year as there is no water supply at the Garden. We have now set up a large water tank to harvest rain water. With a full tank and water butts we should have more reserves in future. We have also installed solar lights to provide lighting in the seating area.



Next year we plan to plant more vegetables and continue clearing the beds at the back and side of the garden. We are grateful for all your donations which are used to maintain the Garden and buy seeds and plants. Thank you to

Over the last three months, three Par Bay Big Local residents have won UnLtd awards. These awards are made to individuals who having identified a local, regional or national issue have found a solution to the problem they have recognised. These social entrepreneurs have started ventures that create social benefit and generate income from sales of products and/or services. So many congratulations to Paul, Jessiny and Karen. The social entrepreneur award programme runs across Par Bay and is a collaboration between Par Bay Big Local and UnLtd. Any one over the age of 18 living, volunteering or working in the Par Bay Big Local areas who wants to start or is growing a venture that will create social benefit is eligible to apply for an award.

As part of the Social Entrepreneur programme, a local social enterprise, Cultivate Cornwall, have and will continue to run regular networking events across Par Bay to support local social entrepreneurs, social enterprises and businesses. Cultivate Cornwall ran a "soup" event in October, bringing together a wide range of people to an evening meeting, who while eating Soup (provided by a local social entrepreneur) listened to pitches made by social entrepreneurs seeking investment and support. "A pub doesn't belong to a company. Even if you've had the paperwork done, and it's been in the same name for 100 years, it's just temporary ownership — it always belongs to the community. It's a public house."

That's the lesson I learnt from Iain, the manager of the Bevy community pub in Brighton, on the learning journey in Par Bay, Cornwall. Whether it is a hall, a bookshop, a garden or a running track, these are all community assets, and they belong to the people who use them. Our conversation over tea and cake helped ground me in the ethos of the work that was happening in the space all around us.

I visited the town along with prospective and current UnLtd award winners from around the UK, like Iain, who wanted to learn how to create and grow sustainable businesses. One group had travelled from as far as Dundee to see what the community of entrepreneurs in Cornwall are

Par Bay is a Big Local area, one of 19 such places in which UnLtd and Local <u>Trust</u> work together to support enterprising people, growing and starting businesses that benefit their community. We were treated to a tour of the ventures in this area community garden, community owned running track, a recycled paint shop, and a hall named Cornubia that was the hub for our day - all within five minutes walk of each other....
